


Swachh Bharat Abhiyan (Adopted Area)






VISIT TO MENTAL HOSPITAL

T.Y.B.A student went for Mental Hospital with 23 students. They went there along with our madam DR. Babita Sinha. They started from JB Nagar metro to Ghatkopar. They took train for Thane and from there to mental hospital. After reaching there Mrs. Kulkarni and Mrs. Farida madam gave orientation of Mental Hospital.

Mental Hospital specialize in the treatment of serious mental disorder, such as clinical depression, schizophrenia and other various types of personality disorders.

Thane Mental Hospital have 72 Hector of land Around 1600 patients are treated in this hospital. There are two wards, Male and Female. For male ward 15 units and for Female 15 unit are available.

Admission is done through court in two types. 1) R.O-> Reception Order. 2) D.O-> Detention Order. Procedure is of around 10 days.

1" visit starts from O.P.D with case paper Doctor takes history of patient after that they provide treatment.

Discharge procedure -> Hospital have monthly committee in that there is one Judge. They evaluate the patient behaviour and discuss the improvement on patient mental health. After that they give (LOA) leave of discharge to patient charges are 22 Rs. Per day charge.

In this visit students saw many patients who were suffering mental illness like Schizophrenia, Depression and other Personality Disorders. This is in the Abnormal psychology syllabus. So students understood the mental disorder by seeing patient. They saw patient who were very young but they were suffering from drug addiction. They were treated with medicines and therapy was provided by therapist. Hospital management gave them some work like planting and gardening.

Students gained empathy for the patient. They also get some experience that how the work is going in mental Hospital, how they treat patient.

For future career this field study is very important.






SUMMER SOLSTICE
