The society is commonly known by its initials, BNHS. BNHS is the partner of Bird Life International in India. It has been designated as a 'Scientific and Industrial Research Organization' by the Department of Science and Technology. India is a Pan India wild life research center organization which promotes the cause of nature conservation for the past 133 years. The Conservation Education Center (CEC) is an education and awareness wing of BNHS. It is situated on 33 acres forest land of BNHS nature reserve which lies between Sanjay Gandhi National park and Film City. The CEC has developed 161 types of educational material and it has around 500 books based on education and natural history. The Hornbill is the official logo of BNHS since 2004. There are various programs arranged by CEC for students as well as corporates. The CEC conducts camps, nature treks and various other activities to bring citizens and nature closer helping to create an unbreakable bond between the two.

After the induction the manager form a two group and with the group was accompanied by the professor. During the course of our trek we saw a variety of flora and fauna and we also saw various new types of insects and birds indigenous to the area. Students were very inquisitive and curious to learn about all of these species. The climate was very pleasant with drizzles of rains after we witnessed the magic of nature and saw water turn into pearl drops on the leaves which left all of us mesmerized. The forest looked exquisite, drenched in the rain and there was greenery all around which we seldom see in the city.
